Over the years several lakhs of people including students belonging to weaker sections of the society and a host of charitable institutions, schools, colleges, vocational training institutions and other educational institutions, hospitals, old age homes, orphanages and other such institutions have benefited throughout the country pursuant to the financial/other assistance rendered by JAL/associate Trusts/Societies. ### HEALTH CARE

#### Jindal Naturecure Institute, Bangalore

In 1979, the Founder, Dr. S. R. Jindal started a charitable hospital in the name and style "The Institute of Naturopathy and Yogic Sciences" now known as 'Jindal Naturecure Institute' to practice and provide cure by a drugless therapy based on Naturopathy and Yoga. The Institute is spread over an area of 100 acres. A great deal of emphasis was laid on therapeutic Yoga, discipline, diet and ambience. The diagnostics are kept in line with modern medical science. Today, Jindal Naturecure Institute has bed strength of 450 including 60 beds in free ward and 200 beds meant for economically weaker sections of the society, attracting patients across the world.



#### Jindal Rural Charitable Hospital, Bangalore

This is a full-fledged allopathic charitable hospital established in 1989 to meet the medical needs of poor people in rural areas. Nearly 1000 patients avail the out-patient facilities daily, free of cost. It is a well equipped hospital with latest and sophisticated diagnostic equipments including full-fledged modern laboratory. Medical and para-medical staff who are well trained and qualified render services in various specialties. Lakhs of people living in neighbouring villages who were so long deprived of basic medical facilities are benefited. The hospital conducts cancer surgery and eye operations regularly. All the facilities in the hospital including medicine, consultation, surgery, accommodation etc. are provided free of cost. Besides, 4 mobile dispensaries provide medical help at the door steps of the villagers every day.

#### INYS Medical Research Society (Research in Naturopathy & Yoga), Bangalore

The need for research in the field of medical efficacy of Naturopathy, and also in Yoga is a neglected subject so far. Dr.Jindal himself being a naturopath and an academicians, took the matter up and started a Research wing, wherein research on various diseases is conducted.

#### Jindal Charitable Hospital, Bangalore

Started in 1987, the hospital is run by Jindal Hospital Society at Rajajinagar, Bangalore, a location predominantly comprising of urban-poor and lower middle class. On an average 500 out-patients are treated in this hospital daily, free of cost.



#### Health Education Centre, Bangalore

First Health Museum of its kind in the country, started in 2011 in JNI campus. Patients are educated about various ailments and their redressal methods through working models and educative movies.

#### Manav Seva Charitable Polyclinic, Delhi

Established in 2001 near Vasant Kunj at Delhi, it is a day care polyclinic providing ECG, eye testing, dental, X-ray, physiotherapy and laboratory facilities. Medicines and consultation are provided free of cost to all patients. Daily around 400 patients avail the facilities at this polyclinic.



#### Sushruta Trauma Centre, Delhi

Constructed on a plot of around 1.5 acre in Delhi worth over Rs.50 crores, the hospital was donated to the Government of NCT, Delhi where a trauma centre is being run by the Government, free of charge for the poor.

### EDUCATION

#### Jindal Public School, Bangalore

Started by Jindal Education Society in 1968, it is a charitable school. It caters to the needs of the children from neighbouring villages. It is imparting education from Nursery to 10th Standard in English medium. The present strength of the school is 1500. Since its inception, the results in the 10th Standard (SSLC) Board examinations are 100% pass with more than 95% in 1 class. Fees charged in the school is very nominal - less than 50% of fees prevailing in other nearby schools. Students belonging to poor families are granted freship and substantial concession.



#### Jindal Pre-University College for Women, Bangalore

Many girl students hailing from the rural areas were not in a position to pursue their education further, as they could not afford high fees, and travel all the way to nearby town and cities. In order to assist the rural girls, Dr. S. R. Jindal started the Jindal Pre-University College, where rural girl students are able to pursue pre-university education in science, computer science and commerce stream at nominal fees/freship. Nearly 400 girl students are availing education in this college.

#### PG College of Naturopathy & Yoga, Bangalore

Research and higher education in Naturopathy and Yoga is an urgent need of the day. Keeping this in mind, Jindal Naturecure Institute has established a post graduate college offering MD in Naturopathy and Yoga. The college is supported by well equipped laboratory, library, hostel facility etc. and aims to be acknowledged as an institute par excellence.

#### Sawan Public School, Delhi

JAL established this residential school in 1974 called 'Sawan Public School' at Chhattarpur Road, Delhi. This school was run for the poor but owing to its high standard, the children from better off sections were also attracted, resulting in great demand and pressure for securing admissions.

#### Bangalore School of Economics, Bangalore

It is proposed to establish the Bangalore School of Economics at Bangalore for which a donation of Rs. 100 crore has been offered to Bangalore University. Govt. of Karnataka has taken keen interest in this project.

#### Merit Scholarships

S.J.F. Foundation established by JAL grants/dispurses scholarships to poor deserving students for carrying on their higher studies since its inception in 1969. Scholarship is granted for pursuing all the courses such as graduation, post-graduation, agriculture, veterinary science, engineering, medical courses etc. Scholarship amount varies from Rs. 400/- to Rs. 2500/- p.m. depending upon the course of study. At present nearly 12,000 students from all over the country are availing scholarship from this Trust without any discrimination of caste, creed and colour. An amount of Rs. 4.25 crores has been disbursed during the current year.

#### Book Donation Scheme

The Book Bank Scheme introduced in 1991-92 has supplied numerous books to colleges and also Gold Medals have been instituted in a few Universities.

### RURAL AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT

Six institutions (Degree Colleges and ITIs) at Village Nalwa, Haryana have been set up by JAL.

#### Mahila Arts & Crafts Charitable Institute, Bangalore

This institute was set up in 1990 and is imparting free of cost training in tailoring, embroidery, typing shorthand, computer education, adult education, beautician course, tie & dye course etc. for such category of women who are totally helpless, destitute and economically backward, so that they may become independent and use the training gained to earn their livelihood. About 300 poor women get benefits of the facilities provided by this institute every year. This institute is also donating sewing machines to deserving poor women to earn their livelihood in villages. Number is being increased to 500.



#### Adoption of 117 Villages in Karnataka

On the occasion of its Silver Jubilee Celebrations in 1995, Jindal Aluminium Ltd. (JAL), adopted 100 villages and constructed school buildings for facilitating imparting of education to rural children in 117 villages for meeting their three basic needs, i.e. education, potable water and medical facilities. These school buildings were handed over to the village panchayats/Govt. of Karnataka and are running smoothly.



JAL employees team and students groups are visiting the villagers to educate them about harmful effects of substance abuse and unhygienic conditions.

#### Donations

(a) Jindal Aluminium Ltd. has been giving donations to several charitable organisations liberally in crores of rupees under section 35AC, 35(1)(ii) and 80G of Income Tax Act. For the past four years, the amount of donations given is shown in the table (on right).

(b) SJF established by JAL is giving recurring and non-recurring donations to other charitable institutions throughout the country. At present about 500 such institutions are getting donations from the Trust every year. Large amount of non recurring donations are also given to various institutions for construction of hospitals, school buildings, medical equipments etc. Total of Rs. 1.20 crore has been disbursed in the current year.

### PRIZE SCHEME

In order to recognise and encourage individuals/organisations doing exemplary work so as to catalyse social upliftment in the country, SJF established by JAL launched a prize scheme in 2011. The prizes of Rs. 1 crore each, which is the largest in India are awarded in seven categories:
