a bit about our founder and visionary

George Ebenezzer is a recognized expert in the field of human engineering and development, with a special focus on children. He’s conducted programs in 150+ education contexts and has spoken to over 500,000 children in 200+ cities and 27 countries, over the past two decades.

He’s a frequent trainer, teacher and key-note speaker in conferences, seminars and programs. Some notable examples of this includes working with the UN in Relief Efforts and being a member of the World Without Orphans global facilitation team.

Child Healing Centre

Being built into a state-of-the-art facility, our Children’s Trauma Therapy Centre, was carefully planned and developed with input from renowned experts like Dr. Robi Sonderegger, Dr. Judith Cohen, Dr. Mary Dozier and Dr. Bruce D Perry. Our team also visited acclaimed institutions like the Oxford Development Centre and University of Pittsburgh Medical Centre and incorporated sensory integrated architecture into the construction project. The first phase of the building project is slated for completion by January 2020, while the timeline for the complete construction of the Centre would depend on the inflow of funds.

our response

FAMILY-BASED CARING

Children need families not institutions. Our founders have brought 9 orphans into their family, who have grown from children into strong and able teenagers.

Future: We intend to use the family as a model for other foster families, that we plan to support and equip.

HEALING

Victims of abuse should never have to fend for themselves. We’re building a trauma therapy centre catered to rehabilitating child victims of abuse. We are also equipping institutions and individuals to intervene in the same space themselves, having trained or spoken to over 5500 individuals.

Future: Complete construction of the first phase of the trauma therapy centre and equip over 5000 childcare professionals in 2019-20.

SPONSORING

We want children to reach for their dreams. We’ve sponsored the education of 120 underprivileged children, over two states.

Future: Sponsor another 100 children between 2019-21.

REACHING OUT

No child should be forgotten or neglected. Through intervention camps, language programs and gifting projects we’ve reached over 5000 children & teenagers, many of whom have come from areas of extreme poverty like remote tribal areas or abusive and traumatic backgrounds.

Future: Reach out to another 1000 children and teenagers between 2019-21.

MENTORING/TRANSFORMING

We’re setting up a mentoring centre for orphans transitioning out of their homes/orphanages. This 1-2-year program will teach them life-skills as they establish themselves in the outside world.

Future: Will commence March 2020.
