ACC's Disaster Response Initiatives

Uttarakhand faced devastation during disastrous flash floods in June 2013. ACC's Disaster Response Team (DRT) reached out to affected villages in Uttarkashi region. 24 volunteers from various units of north region joined hands with SU Dehradun. ACC's DRT provided relief to the people through ACC Mobile Health Unit, doctors, nurse and pharmacist, along with safe drinking water, food and clothing. The District Administration appreciated the consistent management support provided by the ACC team. The DRT worked in partnership with local NGO Bhuvaneshwari Mahila Asharam, Uttarkashi and along with district administration. ACC complemented district administration's effort by immediately arranging 5000 polypropylene bags to ensure that the relief material moves well in time and without getting wet. A special effort of procuring pediatric and gastrointestinal medicine was done for the District Health system, which was highly appreciated by the Chief Medical Officer, Uttarkashi. Relief material for displaced families including tents, solar lanterns, sleeping bag, blankets, daily utilities and kitchen utensils was also arranged. In addition, sanitation units and water treatment units were installed in five worst affected villages. Further, farmers in five worst affected villages have been trained and supplied with high yielding variety vegetable seeds and are being supported through on the spot guidance to sustain their livelihood. ACC is working with the district team for long term disaster mitigation support.

Relief To Drought Affected Areas In Marathwada



Maharashtra faced drought situation in Marathwada region. ACC's Nagpur Sales Unit played a pivotal role to make drinking water accessible to the communities there. Supply of drinking water through water tankers was arranged for Jalna and Beed district towns serving a total population of two lakhs. In addition to this drinking water supply was also arranged for 104 villages around Silod taluka of Aurnagabad district.

Further ACC partnered with Indian Society of Structural Engineers for taking up an initiative for drought proofing. Under this initiative a 4 m high and 12 m long check dam was constructed at village Rohanwadi of District Jalna. This also involved deepening of channel in the upstream, which helped in water retention and percolation of water. Now in early monsoon 2013, the check dam was filled and effect of water recharge was visible.
