

Sustainability at work

Vedanta Group is a globally diversified natural resources company committed to developing empowered and sustainable societies across the four continents where it operates. The Group's projects are based out of India, Australia, Ireland, Sri Lanka, Zambia, Namibia, South Africa and Liberia. Vedanta is one of the largest investors on community initiatives, having contributed US\$ 36.56 million for various initiatives in 2010-11.

Sustainability is at the heart of all activities undertaken at Vedanta. This vision is uniformly shared by the group companies that include Hindustan Zinc - the world's largest integrated zinc-lead producer, Sesa Goa - India's largest iron ore exporter in the private sector, Cairn India - one of the country's top crude oil producers, Balco and Vedanta Aluminium - who together make the Group the largest manufacturer of aluminium in the country, and Sterlite Industries, one of the largest producers of copper in India. The Konkola Copper Mines in Zambia, Zinc International in Namibia, South Africa and Ireland, and Tasmania Copper Mines in Australia complete the global picture of the enterprise. Vedanta takes a holistic approach encompassing integrated child development, health, education, skill development and women empowerment. These initiatives, run in partnership with the Government and NGOs, have impacted the lives of over 2.7 million people in over 550 villages.

Vedanta Chairman, Mr. Anil Agarwal says: "Much has been achieved over many areas, but ensuring sustainable development is a never-ending journey."

Social Investment

Passionately committed to the communities where they operate, Vedanta's focus is on ensuring that every child gets nutritious meals, education and healthcare. Towards this, they run aanganwadis, day-care centres and provide for mid-day meals in schools across India. Vedanta implements various tailor-made initiatives that complement formal and informal education systems, including computer education, infrastructure development and providing remedial and tutorial classes. Enabling functional literacy among

rural women in India is another significant area of contribution. The concept of total sanitation, safe drinking water and immunisation are other key initiatives. A 350-bed Vedanta Cancer Hospital is being set up in Raipur, Chhattisgarh, while the Vedanta Hindustan Zinc Heart Hospital is coming up in Udaipur, Rajasthan. One of the goals of their African operations has been to bring about behavioural change in a million people towards HIV AIDS.

In the area of livelihood, Vedanta's approach is to give people opportunities to increase their income through means that are technically feasible, financially viable, ecologically sustainable and culturally acceptable.

Vedanta is also focussed on restoring natural systems and improving natural resource management at the grass root level. Watershed management, wadi development, cattle breed improvement and cash crop farming are some of their flagship initiatives in the farm sector.

In the last six years, Vedanta's projects have reached over 23,000 farmers. Over 18,500 acres of land has been brought under cultivation and watershed projects, while over 4.5 lakh cattle have been cared for through animal husbandry drives and veterinary projects.

The collective impact has been a 43 per cent increase in the agri-output per acre of land and a 31 per cent increase in milk productivity per cow.
