So far, HPPI has implemented more than 140 projects all over the country in the areas of education, livelihood and community development, health, environment and microfinance.

HPPI strives to design and develop programmes in alignment with the Sustainable Development Goals. HPPI is proud to be working with visionary CSR partners who have given the programmes continued support.

HPPI is currently implementing **54** projects in the states of Rajasthan, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Jharkhand, Telangana, Tamil Nadu and Delhi, reaching out to more than **two million** people annually – in partnership with **67** partners, which include Government departments, private corporations, banks, financial institutions and international funding agencies.



Education

HPPI has been consistently working to address the drop in learning levels of children in Government schools. Sustained efforts have been made to integrate out of school children into formal schools through Step Up Centres and Academy for Working Children. The Necessary Teacher Training programme is implemented together with the State Government to train teachers who are motivated, child-oriented, and focus on enabling positive learning in the child.



Environment

HPPI is working to make a difference to various aspects of the environment and attempting to improve quality of life in rural and urban communities. The initiatives include conserving natural resources, use of solar energy and promotion of biogas as alternative renewable energy sources, plantation of trees, water recycling and promotion of modern irrigation technology.

Microfinance

The Microfinance division of HPPI started in the year 2007 with the aim to economically empower rural women. It has since then assisted more than one lakh poor women with small loans to improve their livelihood in both farm and non-farm activities. HPPI helps these women by making unsecured micro-credit accessible for income generating activities that result in augmenting their family income.



Livelihood & Community Development

The livelihood development programme has been a significant initiative taken by HPPI since 1998. The issues faced by the communities are identified and addressed through empowering and supporting community based groups leading to positive social change and sustainable development. Under this programme, the various activities undertaken are aligned with the schemes run by the Government. Focus is also on implementation of large scale programmes for women in financial literacy and entrepreneurship training.



Health and Sanitation

In the area of health, the focus is on prevention and control of communicable diseases such as HIV/AIDS and TB as well as non-communicable diseases such as diabetes. HPPI has been empowering vulnerable community groups to understand their health concerns through awareness generation interventions and capacity building of community based groups; Self Help Groups, youth groups, adolescent groups etc. Through successful initiatives, the members of the local governance bodies are linked to the communities for better access to development.
