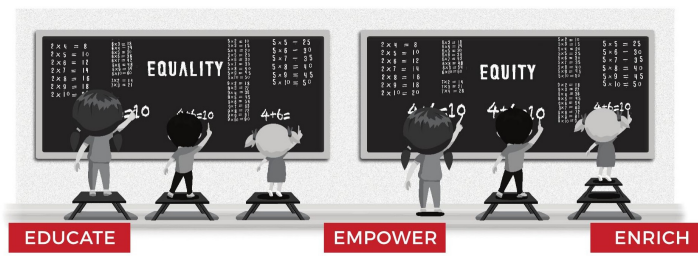

Every day, **14+** volunteers work in a WCF school or deliver a program, across **10** countries

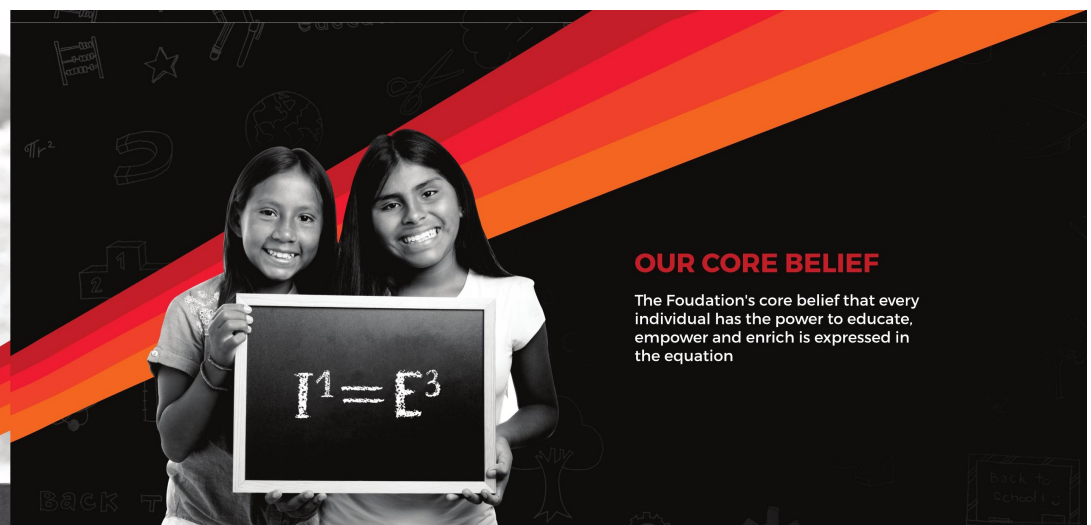

169 schools have benefited from our computer-aided literacy program, giving **63,395** children access to digital-led education.



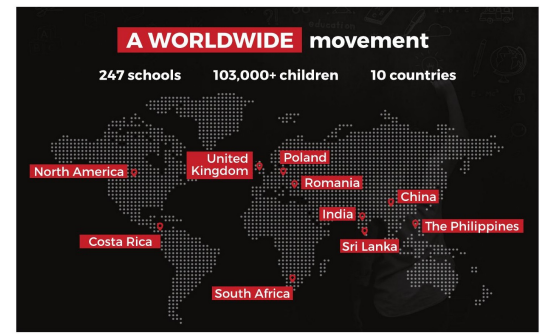
92,755 children now have enhanced language skills, thanks to reading programs conducted through mobile van libraries, school libraries and community library set ups, globally.



114 schools have benefited from self-defense programs that have equipped **5,998** girl children with the skills to defend themselves.



1.2 million children have learnt to stay safe in cyber space thanks to the Cyber-Security Awareness Program **#ThinkTalkTeach**, conducted in schools and through multiple social media channels.

Global Impact Day (GID)

GID brings together every member of WNS globally to celebrate the impact created by Foundation throughout the year. The recent Cyber Awareness drive impacted 135,000 children from 345 schools across 9 countries.
